WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 15 BIBLE STUDY COMING UP CHAPTER: 10 TOPIC: CHARACTER TEST

The next Bible Study is Wednesday, November 15, at 6 pm via Zoom. A link to this online meeting will be sent on Monday, November 13. To join the group for the first time, please email FPCR or contact leader, Elaine Schmidt.

The group continues to study the Book of John and will discuss John 18:28-19:16 on November 15.

The purpose of October's lesson (Trial & Trust) was to show Jesus' self-control and confidence in a time of trial. This gives us assurance during our difficult times. We CAN handle these things—with God's help.

The group discussed that the betrayal and arrest of Jesus was preordained and orchestrated. Jesus knew what was going

to happen. He wanted to make it easy for Judas to find Him. The soldiers who found Him certainly didn't expect a confident, powerful "king". What a situation!

Also discussed was that we can do all we want to try to "orchestrate" an event in our lives, but God determines the next steps the Lord's will be done! So, think before lashing out at Him.

Peter was also discussed as part of this study—he failed Jesus. He wasn't strong enough on his own. We often find ourselves in that situation. We need to continually practice by praying, talking more openly about God/Jesus, and acting as He has taught us to act.

SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

FPCR's session met on Monday, October 30. The agenda/discussion included:

- Copies of the Apostle's Creed have been added to the back of the new hymnals.
- A \$250 donation will be sent to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to support humanitarian work in Palestine/Israel.
- Ideas to increase FPCR's visibility to the community were given and discussed. Watch for "spiffy" feather flags and possibly signs.
- Approval was given to have a maintenance check-up on both of the furnaces.
- Another water check with the Health Department will take place now that the well pump has been replaced.

- Communion dates were set for the first Sunday of each month in 2024.
- Advent and Christmas events were approved including Hanging of the Greens on November 26 and take down of the decorations on January 7.
- Food donations for the Slinger Food Pantry will include daily donations of items gathered in boxes during Advent. (FPCR did such a wonderful job with these gifts last year!)
- Gingerbread House Donations, November 26 and December 3; Joy Offering, December 17 and 24.
- The membership rolls were reviewed.
- The annual Congregational Meeting was set for January 28, 2024.

PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING

Thank You! A total of **\$440** was collected during the Peace and Global Witness Special Offering. FPCR mailed checks for \$110 to the Slinger Food Pantry; \$110 to the Presbytery of Milwaukee; and \$220 to the Presbyterian Church(USA)/Presbyterian Missions to further peacemaking initiatives around the world.
