
How might you participate?

- 1. Check the graphic below, church website, flyer distributed by Rick and Cathy Romanski, or contact Romanskis at 262-628-3822 for the list.
- 2. Grab a bag or box and add the grocery item(s) listed daily from December 1 through December 17. Say a short prayer for the recipient as you put the item in the bag/box! By the end of the list, you will have collected the sides for a holiday meal (and more) to be donated to a Slinger Food Pantry individual/family.
- 3. On December 17, bring your bag or box to FPCR. The Romanskis will deliver it to the Food Pantry prior to Christmas.

If you are looking for an alternative to bagging or boxing the listed items, monetary donations are always welcome. Pick up a Slinger Food Pantry envelope in the Narthex or mail a check with FPCR on the memo line to PO Box 22, Richfield, WI 53076.
