The group continues to study the Book of John and will discuss John 16:5-15 on July 16.

June's lesson, *The Cost of Friendship*, was based on John 15:12 to 16:4. The first question asked us to pray for our closest friend. The group then discussed important qualities of friends. From there, the discussion expanded to some of the issues we face when being a friend. The lesson emphasized that Jesus is our friend. We are privileged that he wishes to have a personal relationship with us. Also discussed was how our relationship with Jesus is a model for the



relationships in our lives. It was noted that there are many non-Christians in today's world who treat Christians poorly. Prayer is a solution. Praying will help us to be strong and courageous in difficult situations.

Next month's topic, *Secrets of the Spirit*, begins with a discussion about saying goodbye and helps us understand how the Holy Spirit is available as we face struggles and problems.



JUNE SERMON JOTTINGS

Date: June 4, 2023 Text: Matthew 7:21-29 Sermon: Built on a Rock By: Paul J. Zachow, MAPS, Pulpit Supply

The setting for this sermon is the end of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. He is teaching that one's faith and life needs to be built on the sure rock of God—not on sand.

• We are called to build our faith on the rock of God—not the unsure footing of sand which will cave in when

problems arrive. We are called to have a personal relationship with God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.

- Stephen Butler Murray writes that according to John Calvin . . . Christian believers today should live reflectively, representing the will of God and the advice of Jesus as best they may. (Feasting on the Word, Yr. A, Vol. 3, Pg. 96, Stephen Butler Murray).
- We are justified by our faith; we should think reflectively about our faith.
- We are called to live out our faith built on the foundation of the rock of God.
- We are called to live out the good news by doing good in the world, our lives, the church, and our communities.
- There are times we doubt our faith. This is a normal part of being human. We are called to build our lives on our faith and the solid rock of God even a little at a time.
- Those who hear and act on Jesus' teachings and focus on compassionate treatment of others represent the will of God and provide a solid foundation.

Date: June 18, 2023 (Father's Day) Text: Romans 5:1-8 Sermon: Hope By: Paul J. Zachow, MAPS, Pulpit Supply

This lesson is about Paul speaking to the early Christian church. His topic is being justified through faith. He is providing the people with encouragement to have hope in the midst of their suffering and is explaining that God will be with them.

- God accepts us as we are. God is gracious, loving, and steadfast. This gives us hope.
- We do not earn God's grace—it is given freely from God.
- The love of God is poured out to us in the Holy Spirit.
- Believers may grow strong and rejoice in adversity.
- "The love of God is so powerful that it sustains us through suffering and empowers us to act according to our faith." *Feasting on the Word*, Yr. A., Vol. 3, Pages 136 and 183, Diane Givens Moffett.
- We are called to have hope in spite of what we face.

FOR YOUR RECIPE COLLECTION

Carol Frank brought yummy treats to FPCR for Father's Day. Below is the cookie recipe requested by several individuals. Thanks for sharing, Carol!

MOLASSES COOKIES

2 cups All-Purpose Flour 1-1/2 tsp Baking Soda 1 tsp Cinnamon 1/2 tsp Nutmeg 1/2 tsp Salt 1-1/2 cups Sugar 1-1/2 sticks (12 tbsp) Butter, softened 1 large Egg 1/4 cup Molasses

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place 1/2 cup of the sugar in small bowl & set aside. Whisk flour, baking soda, spices, and salt together in medium bowl. Cream butter and remaining cup of sugar in large bowl. Beat in egg then molasses. Gradually mix in flour mixture just until a dough forms. Pinch off about a tablespoon of dough and roll into balls then roll in reserved sugar to coat. Arrange balls about 3 inches apart on baking sheets. Bake 10-15 minutes, just until the edges are firm.

Cool 1 minute on baking sheets then place cookies on racks or parchment paper to cool completely.
