



Help Promote Peace Locally and Globally

"Pursue What Makes for Peace" is the theme of this year's Peace and Global Witness offering to promote peace locally and globally. At FPCR, this offering will be accepted on September 28 and October 5 and is one of the four special offerings sponsored by PC(USA).

FPCR retains 25% (gifted to the Slinger Food Pantry) to support peacemaking efforts locally; 25% is sent to the Synod of Lakes and Prairies for peacemaking efforts at the regional level; and 50% is sent to Presbyterian Church (USA)/Presbyterian Mission

to support peacemaking, reconciliation, and global witness. Special envelopes will be available in the narthex for your gifts.

The Beatitudes . . . A Gift from God

At FPCR recently reviewed the Beatitudes. A set of blessings spoken by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount, they describe characteristics of those who are blessed by God and include: **Blessed are** the poor in spirit; Blessed are those who mourn; Blessed are the meek; Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness; Blessed are the merciful; Blessed are the pure in heart; Blessed are the peacemakers; and Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness.


