
HELLO FROM JOYCE

MARCH SERMON JOTTINGS

Date: March 5, 2023 Text: John 3:1-17 Sermon: Born of the Spirit

The scripture is about Nicodemus, a Jewish teacher of the law and member of the Jewish religious leadership. He encountered Jesus and questioned him about being sent from God. Nicodemus recognizes Jesus as one coming from

God. Jesus refers to being born of the Spirit to enter the kin-dom of God. Nicodemus misunderstands. Jesus is not referring to a physical rebirth but a rebirth by the Spirit of God.

- Being born of the Spirit is not about a future life in heaven, but about our present lives. We are called to live in the never-ending presence of God.
- We all have suffering and challenges. Bring this suffering and these challenges to God in prayer with hope of finding new life, hope, and light in the midst of darkness. Then listen to and for God. Follow the ways of the Spirit of God, the kin-dom of God, and not the ways of the world.
- We are all dependent on God in our faith and in our lives and in the world.
- Where in your life do you need to be born of the Spirit? Where do you need renewal and hope in your life? Pray Listen Follow.

Date: March 19, 2023 Text: John 9:1-41 Sermon: Open Our Eyes

The scripture was about a man who is born blind and has his sight restored through Jesus's healing powers. Jesus encounters the man, sees him not as "other" but as a human being worthy of dignity. He sees him as a beloved child of God who deserves nothing less than respect and healing. The disciples claimed the man was blind because of his/his parents' sins. The Pharisees didn't believe his sight was restored. Lots of questions! Jesus did not accept the connection between sinful actions and illness.

- "Vision is the art of seeing what is invisible to others." (Jonathan Swift)
- We need to look deep into our own hearts to have our vision become clearer.
- What are you blind to in your life and in your faith life?
- How can we have our eyes (and hearts) opened to see God and Christ in one another and the world around us?
- God loves all of us regardless of our blindness, flaws, and faults. He calls us to open our eyes to Jesus. Put your hope in God this Lenten season.
- The Light of the World is in our midst—open your eyes wide to the light in your lives and in the world.
