ALMOND-GINGER BISCOTTI

Crisp and Crunchy. Perfect to dip into a cup of hot tea or coffee. Thank you, Martha Stewart, for this easy, low-calorie recipe . . . and thank you, **Carol Frank**, for sharing this recipe.

Makes 3 dozen

1 cup all-purpose flour
3/4 cups sugar plus extra for dusting
2 teaspoons baking powder
2 tablespoons grated lemon zest (about 2 lemons)
1/4 teaspoon salt
1-1/2 cups whole almonds
1/4 cup chopped crystallized ginger
3 large eggs
2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together flour, 3/4 cup sugar, baking powder, zest & salt. Stir in almonds and ginger.
3. Transfer dough to a lightly floured work surface, knead until smooth. Divide dough in half. Shape into two logs, each about 1-inch high and 3-inches wide. Place on parchment-covered baking sheet. Sprinkle with remaining sugar.
4. Bake until logs are puffed and outside is firm--the tops may crack--about 30 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely, about 2 hours.
5. Using a serrated knife, thinly slice logs crosswise, 1/4-inch thick. Lay slices on parchment-lined baking sheets. Bake until crisp and lightly golden, rotating pans and turning biscotti over halfway through the 20 minutes total baking time. Cool completely before storing.

SERMON JOTTINGS

With our present schedule, it is sometimes difficult to follow the continuum of church lessons and sermons. Here are the summary notes from the June services.

Date: **June 5, 2022 (Pentecost)**

Text: **Acts 2:1-21**

Sermon: ***Spirit***

Pentecost—celebrated 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus.

The setting for today’s scripture is a house in Jerusalem. There are people from nations located in all directions. While gathered, the people heard a mighty wind (the Holy Spirit). All were talking in their native languages. All heard the Holy Spirit speak to them. Imagine their puzzlement!

Then, Peter spoke, telling them it was not the wine, but the Holy Spirit. Some believed him, some did not, just as today. (Peter was a rejected disciple just as Jesus had been.)

- Even though diverse, we are all united in the Holy Spirit.
- The Holy Spirit came to teach the people and disciples the good news of love for all.
- Pentecost represents the inbreaking of God’s purposes for all humanity, bringing humanity together. The followers of Jesus are now given the gift of empowerment by the Holy Spirit.
- Communicating in all languages represented the first gift of the Holy Spirit and brought the good news to all.
- On this Pentecost Sunday we are called to come together in unity, one in and through Christ, and care for and love one another every day.
- Listen to the winds of the Holy Spirit in your life!

Date: **June 12, 2022 (Trinity Sunday and Memorial Dedication for Jeff Zeller)**

Text: **Romans 5:1-5**

Sermon: ***God’s Love and Light***

- We have peace and reconciliation with and for God and one another.
- Jesus is the “means of access to the grace in which Christians stand” (New Interpreter’s Study Bible).
- Faith allows us a life of peace and confidence before God and assurance that Christ’s ability to save is greater than Adam’s ability to corrupt. (New Interpreter’s Study Bible).
- Pray even when you don’t feel like it. God loves us and accepts us for who we are.
- We are called to be God’s faithful disciples—beacons of God’s love and light in the world.
- Be the light and love in the world today for and with one another in our families, work places, communities, and the larger world. Jeff Zeller modeled this while in our midst.

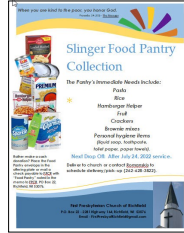

Text: **Acts 2:1-8, 11b-13 & I Corinthians 12: 1, 4-7, 11-13**
Sermon: **Gifts of the Spirit, Personal and Communal**



- Breathe—do it all the time. Conspire—breathe together.
- The Holy Spirit connects us—reminds us our breath comes from God. We take God's spirit in and out each time we breathe—we give it back to God when we die.
- The work of the Holy Spirit is personal and communal—each of us gets personal gifts; we share our communal gifts through the church.
- When talents are directed away from us and toward others, it is truly part of the Holy Spirit. A talent is not a strength until it is shared with others.
- Think what we could accomplish together using our talents and strengths, and then acting on them.
