


The group continues to study the Book of John and will discuss John 15:1-11 on May 7.



APRIL SERMON JOTTINGS

Date: April 2, 2023 - Palm Sunday Text: Matthew 21:1-11 Sermon: Who is This? By: Paul J. Zachow, MAPS, Pulpit Supply

Palm Sunday . . . the day Jesus rode into Jerusalem. The crowds put down their garments and waved palm branches to welcome him. He arrived on a donkey and is a humble servant of God. This procession was the opposite of any held for the Roman Emperor. This sets the stage for Good Friday. Jesus is revered on Palm Sunday, but the

same crowd is against him during his trial and cheers for his crucifixion on Good Friday. Jesus challenged both the Empire's and the Temple's center of power. The Gospel asserts that IT is GOD's word—not Rome's.

- God's reign and presence are manifested in Jesus, not the Emperor.
- God's blessings extend to ALL people, not just the elite.
- Jesus, not Rome, reveals God's will. We should follow the ways of Jesus and God's reign, not that of the world we live in.
- All people are beloved children of God. Jesus did not reject anyone. We should not reject anyone either.
- Give thanks to God for his love for all of us.

Date: April 9, 2023 - Easter Sunday Text: John 20:1-18 Sermon: Live as Easter People By: Paul J. Zachow, MAPS, Pulpit Supply

Today is Easter Sunday. It is a day of hope . . . a day we are called to live as an Easter people. Today marks the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, a day of hope and celebration. Jesus's spirit was raised and new life and renewal came about. Let us rejoice!

- With the crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension, we have all become "children of God." We are ALL beloved children of God.
- Being beloved children of God is a call for us to live as Easter people, in hope and peace; in love from God; in new life and renewal of life. This is a gift from God!

Date: April 15, 2023 (Saturday Service) Text: John 20:19-31 Sermon: Looking for Jesus By: Pastor Cathy Manthei

This is "Holy Humor Sunday". For centuries in all Christian faith traditions, the week following Easter Sunday was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

- Many draw parallels between Elvis and Jesus. Most people never SAW Elvis, but Elvis fans believe that he lives. Without proof. Why can't we live with this kind of faith?
- We all know the Bible story about "Doubting Thomas". We all have lived this story. We doubted and asked God for a sign. (In our world, we are not used to believing until we are absolutely sure something is true!) If only we would have the faith of the Elvis fans-- a belief guided by the faith in our hearts.
