The FPCR group met on January 14 to discuss the Spirit and the Son. Everyone found this lesson a bit more difficult—there was “a lot to grasp!”

## **“Special” Offering Structure Changed**

“Special Offerings are the single, largest way Presbyterians join together to make a lasting impact in the world. Let’s be the Church, together!” This is the goal of Special Offerings as communicated by the national organization, PC(USA).

With that in mind, this article will update you on some changes made after PC(USA) researched the program. The largest change, resulting from the General Assembly meeting in 2024, is that there will now be three instead of four special offerings. Also added was a grant program for local mission needs. The grant program is still being clarified.

Since the two offerings with the smallest “income” and participation were the Peace/Global Witness and the Pentecost offerings, they were combined to now become the World Communion Offering. The hope is that the grant program will be an “equitable” way to take up the “church share” and will be impactful on local mission goals. The following offerings are now being supported by PC(USA):

1. One Great Hour of Sharing – approved for FPCR by the session for March 22 and 29, 2026. The session also decided to give everyone a break from creativity--no fish banks for 2026.
2. World Communion Offering (combination of Pentecost Offering and Peace/Global Witness Offering). The time frame is between September 6 and October 4. The grant program is part of this special offering. A final decision on this offering is pending session approval.
3. Christmas Joy Offering – between November 29 and December 19. Again, the final decision on this offering is pending at FPCR.

In addition to these three offerings, FPCR supports Presbyterian Mission with an annual Mission Pledge (ours is \$450 for 2026). This gift, funded by general offerings at FPCR, is split between the local Presbytery (65%); Synod (15%); and General Assembly (20%).

If you have questions, **Alice Schmitz**, Treasurer, will be happy to answer them or find an answer.

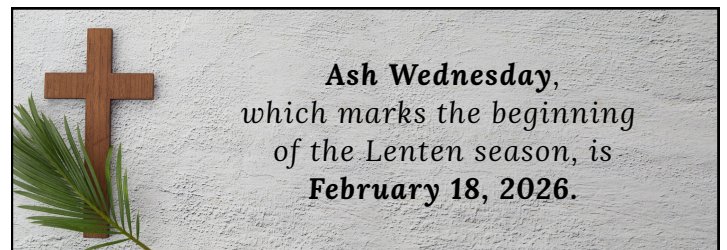
